

- Youth groups, cadets, scouts, football clubs







- A team of Engagement Officers to support and encourage take up and networking



Lancashire Combined Watch Forum Background



- Completely independent, all volunteer committee acting as the NHW Association for Lancashire
- Here to provide support to local associations and individual coordinators
- Represent Lancashire NHW at County and National level
- Since 2018 has sole responsibility for setting up New Watches in the county



Lancashire Combined Watch Forum Background



• Until 2017 Police Watch Liaison Officers provided full time support to NHW:

Setting up New Watches, organising events, communicating with coordinators, etc.

- The WLO role was disestablished during 2017
- Early 2018 LCWF assumed responsibility for providing support to Lancashire NHW





Achievements since last AGM





Achievements since Last AGM

- Completely revised New Watch Process launched
- Now 'own', manage and maintain the Lancashire **NHW Database**
- Improved Communications with coordinators
- Worked with and influenced National NHW strategy
- In discussions with Lancashire Fire and Rescue







- Now involves neighbours and community in setting their watch up and 'approving' their coordinator, a public meeting is required.
- Since March 2018, 22 New Watches have been set up
- Excellent local turnout at set up meetings
- LCWF provides support to new coordinators through the process.
- LCWF will cover non recurring costs and provide window stickers & signs.







- 'Owned' and managed by LCWF
- Hosted on LVP website to maintain data protection
- Access limited to approved personnel
- Now have the ability to contact coordinators directly
- We can and will support third party messaging



Achievements since Last AGM Improved Communications



- We now have the ability to contact coordinators directly
- Regular scams updates circulated
- Monthly Newsletter launched this year
- Completely revised our website <u>www.lcwf.co.uk</u>
- Facebook page maintained
- Working to improve our Social Media capability and presence



Achievements since Last AGM National NHW



- The LCWF represent Lancashire at National Strategy events
- Have now gained access to National NHW Database
- New watches registered on National website will now be referred to LCWF for verification



Achievements since Last AGM Lancashire Fire and Rescue



- LFRS very keen to work with NHW
- Recognise the value of local coordinators in recognising vulnerable / high risk individuals
- They see our new newsletter as an excellent way of communicating their message
- Hold regular in house Safety Days potential for NHW involvement



Home Fire Safety Check Service

Lancashire Fire and Rescue Service aim to make Lancashire Safer by identifying vulnerable people and offering them a Home Fire Safety Check

Our visit provides an assessment of the fire risk and also advice and interventions to reduce this risk
